*C. TDY Periods in Excess of 180 Consecutive Days. When mission objectives or unusual circumstances require TDY in one location for more than 180 consecutive days, and the par. C4430-A criteria are satisfied, the appropriate authority for authorizing/approving TDY assignments in excess of 180 consecutive days at any one location is the Secretary Concerned, the Chief of an appropriate bureau or staff agency specifically designated for that purpose (2 Star equivalent), or Commanders/Deputy Commanders of Combatant commands must determine if TDY of greater than 180 days is appropriate ([38 Comp. Gen. 853 \(1959\)](#)). ***There must be no re-delegation of authority.*** A written request and justification must be forwarded to the Secretary Concerned, the Chief of an appropriate bureau or staff agency specifically designated for that purpose (2 Star equivalent), or Commanders/Deputy Commanders of Combatant commands as soon as practicable. This determination should be made before the order is issued. If the situation does not permit determination before order issuance, the order may be issued and the case submitted immediately to the appropriate authority who must:
